CARCD Updates

- **Registration for the next RCD Board Boot Camp has been extended until April 17!** The retreat will take place May 18-19, 2018 in Oakhurst, CA and directors from all over the state are encouraged to attend. This is a rare opportunity to participate in a program designed to meet the specific needs of RCD leaders. In this training directors will build the confidence that it takes to be successful in the unique work environment of an RCD and meet other RCD directors doing the same kinds of work. - **The CARCD Board of Directors is seeking nominations by May 16 from RCD Regions for their representative to the Forestry Committee, and accepting applications for 3 At-large RCD members to the Forestry Committee.** Participation on the committee is open to board directors, associate directors or staff, and potential candidates do not need to be from a Member District. Hello All,

The California Association of Resource Conservation Districts (CARCD) recently entered into a Cooperative Agreement with U.S. Forest Service Region 5 to conduct technical assistance as required per the Farm Service Agency's Emergency Forest Restoration Program (EFRP). The EFRP was established to carry out emergency measures to restore non-industrial private forest (NIPF) land damaged by natural disaster. The program must provide for the long-term viability of forest trees that have been impacted by an EFRP-designated disaster. This program promotes the control of sheet, rill, scour, gully and other erosion, reduction of water, air or land pollution, restoration of forest health and forest-related resources, promotion of carbon sequestration and restoration and connection of wildlife habitat.

Via this Agreement, CARCD is responsible for leveraging our network of Registered Professional Foresters (RPFs) to provide the following services:

- Furnishing technical assistance*** to applicant as needed
- Determination of needs
- Plan development for each practice
- Certification of compliance as prerequisite for payment

*** Technical assistance includes consultation with the approved landowner, onsite visits, property assessments, writing conservation plans, and verifying implementation aligns with plan objectives.

Via this email, we are soliciting statements of interest from RPFs currently available to complete the required technical assistance. The negotiated hourly rate for the technical assistance work is \$100/hour. Two landowners (one in Siskiyou County, one in Modoc County) are currently waiting for technical assistance; work would begin ASAP, ideally in May 2018. A description of the expected accomplishments and deliverables is enclosed. Experience with the EFRP is not required; the Farm Service Agency and U.S. Forest Service would collaborate to orient the RPF(s) selected.

A summary of the two parcels follows:

Mannix Parcel – Siskiyou County

-

The composition of this 30 acre parcel is approximately 70% Douglass Fir, 25% Ponderosa Pine, and 5% Sugar Pine. Roughly 80 trees will need to be removed per acre; tree replant will be 200–300 per acre or 6,000 to 9,000 total. The goal is to remove the debris, replant, then potentially build a fence to protect the replant (1,500 ft perimeter, estimated).

Copp Parcel – Modoc County

The composition of this 180 acre parcel is primarily conifers. It is estimated that the tree replant about be 435 trees per acre or 78,300 total. The goal is to remove the dead trees (debris removal), replant, and fence to protect the replant (if the landowner does not get approved through ECP).

Hi Folks,

Your job of making amazing conservation happen in your community is really challenging. On a day to day basis you are constantly sorting through the expectations, rules, and best policies to run an effective district so that conservation can happen. To help support you, CARCD strives to bring you the best information so you can make good decisions and stay out of trouble.

There has been a lot of confusion over the ability of RCDs to advocate. I apologize for our role in that confusion.

We have sought the advice of both CSDA and an attorney to clarify the legal abilities of RCDs and have new information to share with you. Here is the nutshell of code:

Government Code section 54964 specifically prohibits the expenditure of public funds for the purpose of supporting or opposing a ballot measure or candidate.

However, Government Code § 53060.5 and the California Supreme Court decision in *Stanson v. Mott* (1976) 17 Cal.3d 206, 213 allow the expenditure of public funds to lobby for or against proposed legislation which will affect the public agency expending the funds. This includes the hiring of lobbyists and the expenditure of public funds to pay the expenses of agency members for the purpose of lobbying the legislature.

What does this mean for you?

1) You are able to talk to legislators about specific legislation and help inform them of the effects on your district and constituents. You are able to take an official position on legislation.

The caveats are that:

- a) It has to be related to the work you do, and
- b) there should be a district policy in place guiding your action.

2) You are not allowed to spend money on bond campaigns (including staff time, copying expenses etc.). There is a grey area that positions on bond measures are deemed by many (including CSDA) to be acceptable because it is not the expenditure of government funding. However, doing any work or spending any money towards those bond positions is not acceptable. CARCD is not ready to take a position on whether its ok to take a position. But CSDA says its acceptable.

CSDA will be releasing more information next week on this topic, please look to their advice on the specifics. We will also be updating our guidebook and offering sample policies to help you navigate the opportunities presented by having a more significant role with your legislator. We wanted to get this information to you in a timely way and now will work to provide resources.

Again, I deeply apologize for the confusion we caused around this. We were working off information from a good source that was based in the practice of state agencies rather than special districts.

Please let me know if you have any additional questions or concerns.

We are here to serve you and strive to make your job easier!

Stream restoration efforts along the coast of Central California are unevenly distributed, with activity more likely to occur in areas that are more highly populated and dominated by residents who are "whiter, wealthier, and more educated," according to an analysis by researchers at the University of California, Santa Cruz.

In addition, coastal stream restoration is heavily concentrated in Santa Cruz, Morro Bay, and southern Santa Barbara County, creating "restoration deserts" with virtually no activity, said lead author Bronwen Stanford, a doctoral candidate in environmental studies.

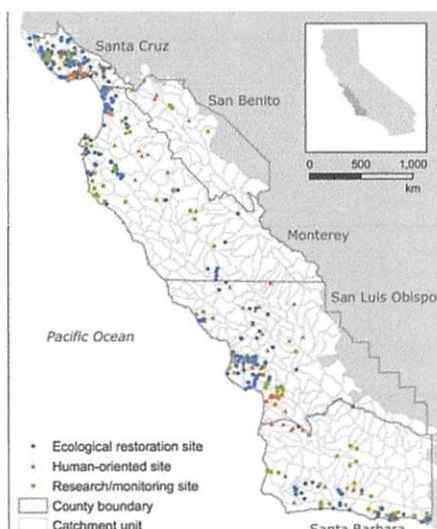
"Restoration projects were really unevenly distributed, and a lot of the Central Coast had no projects at all," said Stanford. "This disparity is troubling for social and ecological reasons. It begs the question, are we overlooking certain communities or certain types of ecological sites?"

Stanford's paper, "Where and why does restoration happen? Ecological and sociopolitical influences on stream restoration in Coastal California," appears in the May issue of *Biological Conservation*, which is online now.

Ecological and social drivers

Stanford's study looked at 699 sites of publicly funded stream restoration projects between Santa Cruz and Santa Barbara counties that were completed between 1983 and 2017.

- * Feel free to also email me the updated budget number and I can update it for you on the admin-end of the database as well.

- * If you RCD would like to pay a custom amount, for whatever reason, please reach out to me and let me know so I can get that invoice made for you.

If your RCD fails to pay its invoice before July 11, 2018 then you will lose access to the RCD Member Portal, which includes receiving emails like this one! We hope that you will take the time to renew your membership and remain part of our community. Your financial contributions are vital to the important work we do on your behalf.

2018 Spring Education Day wrap up!

On Tuesday, March 20th the Annual Spring Education Day was held in Sacramento. There were a total of 175 attendees representing 90 member agencies. SDRMA members who attended were eligible to earn Credit Incentive Points (CIPs) to reduce their contribution amount for both Property/Liability and Workers' Compensation programs. Thanks to all those that attended!

Loss Prevention Allowance Funds Available

The Loss Prevention Allowance Fund was created so members could receive reimbursement for loss prevention efforts. Eligible expenses include:

- *Safety equipment
- *Safety videos
- *Ergonomic equipment
- *Training courses and/or materials related to loss prevention
- *SDRMA or CSDA seminars, conferences, regional trainings or workshops (including travel hotel expenses)

This year the SDRMA Board set aside \$50,000 in both Property/Liability and Workers' Compensation Programs for member loss prevention efforts and funds are still available; \$30k in Property/Liability and \$19k in Workers' Compensation.

Members can submit a request for reimbursement to SDRMA for amounts spent on loss prevention efforts during the program year up to a maximum of \$1,000 per year. All requests must be accompanied by a copy of an invoice and proof of payment. Requests will be processed on a first-come, first-serve basis until the funds are depleted.

Members have already been reimbursed for items such as; SDRMA Safety/Claims Education Days, CSDA seminars and workshops, safety vests and cones, security cameras, ergonomic equipment, eye and ear protection, fire extinguishers, safety boots and gloves, first aid training courses and chlorine leak alarms just to name a few.

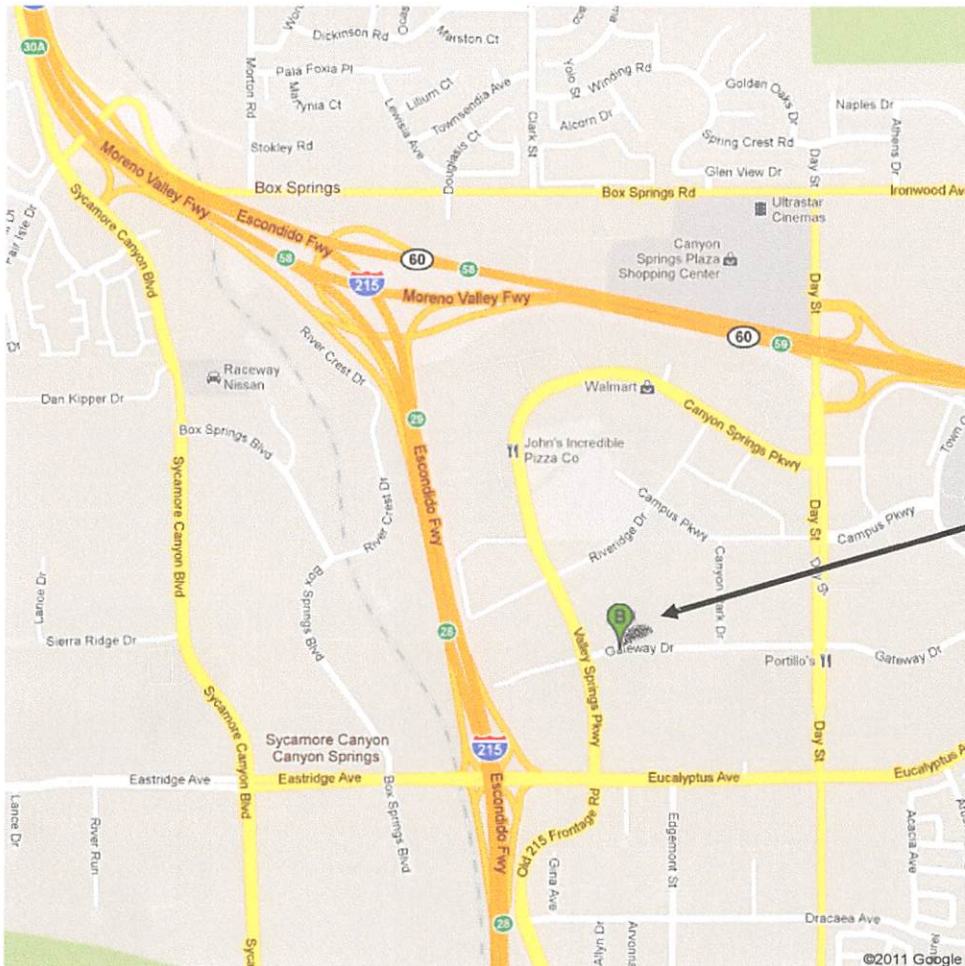

I. Welcome/Introductions

II. Approval of October 26, 2017 Minutes

Chris Neubauer asked to approve the October 26, 2017 meeting minutes. John Kopp stated that the email attachment he received was in 12 point font and that can be hard to read. He requested the minutes be sent in a 14 point font moving forward and that it be broken up into paragraphs. Gabe Taylor stated the standard font used by Disability Rights California is Arial 14. Mr. Neubauer stated he will look into the best format and size to send out future meeting minutes.

Ruthee Goldkorn made a motion to accept the minutes; Mario Janesin seconded. Minutes were accepted.

III. Demonstration of Democracy Live's Remote-Accessible-Vote-by-Mail System

Mr. Neubauer introduced Democracy Live's Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail System. The State has recently certified Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail systems for use in California. Voters Choice Act counties that are moving to the new Vote Center Model under SB-450 are required to have a Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail system in order to move forward with the vote center model voting. Polling place counties, such as Riverside County who cannot go to a vote center model until 2020 are not required to have this system in place. Riverside County is moving forward with this technology because it will enable voters with disabilities to vote independently.

Brian Finney from Democracy Live provided the VAAC with a demonstration on their Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail (RAVBM) system. Mr. Finney shared that Riverside County was one of the first counties to pioneer the use of the accessible sample ballot and now the next step is equal access to the ballot itself.

The RAVBM system is called Secure Select and is an all in one, fully

accessible, audio-enabled, ADA compliant hosted balloting solution. The system allows voters to access their audio enabled ballot online with their choice of screen reader and mark their ballots independently. This ballot marking tool can be completely disconnected from the internet and none of the voter choices are stored. This system has been approved by the Election Assistance Commission (EAC) and the Secretary of State (SOS). Mr. Taylor asked if a test link could be sent out to the VAAC members for this system. Mr. Finney stated that he would send the test link to Mr. Neubauer for distribution to the VAAC members.

IV. Discussion of the 2018 Future of California Elections (FoCE) Conference on March 8, 2018

Mr. Neubauer stated that the 2018 Future of California Elections (FoCE) Conference will take place on March 8, 2018 at the California Endowment in Los Angeles, CA. The Registrar, Assistant Registrar, Chief Deputy and other staff will be attending the conference. The key note speaker will be the Secretary of State, Alex Padilla. Mr. Kopp asked the Registrar's office to discuss SB-450 and tracking the cost of implementation for the pilot counties that are going to the vote center model and bring that issue to Secretary Padilla. Mr. Neubauer stated that SB-450 will definitely be discussed and it will not be a problem to ask about the pilot counties tracking implementation costs. Mr. Taylor stated that he is recruiting volunteers for the conference and if anyone is interested they are offering a significantly reduced cost.

V. Discussion on the Use of the AVU for Voters Who Are Blind or Low Vision

As discussed in the October 26, 2017 meeting, the Registrar of Voters will be conducting an early voting site at Blindness Support Services on a Saturday prior to the June 5th Primary Election. Mr. Neubauer stated that the Registrar's office is looking forward to this collaboration with Blindness Support Services.

This early voting site will provide an accessible voting unit (AVU) in a location the voters are comfortable in and familiar with. Mr. Neubauer stated that if a voter utilizes the AVU they only use it twice a year. The equipment can be confusing and having an AVU training may be helpful to the public. Mr. Neubauer stated that the Registrar's Office is happy to take the AVU out to any other communities that are interested in scheduling a time. Mr. Reutter stated he participated in a beta test for an online ballot system and he asked if the Registrar's Office would be moving forward with that system. Mr. Neubauer clarified that the online tool can be used to make your ballot selections but it will still need to be printed and sent to the Registrar of Voters for processing. Mr. Neubauer stated that the Registrar's Office will be moving forward with the Democracy Live system that was demonstrated this morning.

VI. Discussion on New Voter Registration Card

Mr. Neubauer stated that the Secretary of State has reformatted the registration card and added the question "I want voting materials in an accessible format". He showed a draft version of the card and stated the final version will be coming soon. The label for each section has been moved to the left hand side of the card to be clearer. They also clearly delineated the age because this card covers both registration and pre-registration. Hopefully with these changes it will make it easier for the voter to fill out the registration card. The Registrar's Office will be working with the Elections Management Systems (EIMS) vendor on how to track that request.

Mr. Kopp asked if there is an expected completion date for this new registration card. Mr. Neubauer stated that this is a near final version, and it should be completed within the next month. Mr. Kopp asked if the new form will be widely available and if local printers will be able to print them if the Secretary of State (SOS) cannot supply large enough quantities. Mr. Neubauer stated that the instruction at this time is to use up your existing stock of registration cards. The new version is what the SOS will be sending as replacements upon request.

Ms. Goldkorn stated that the question "I want voting materials in an accessible format" is very vague. She stated that even people with disabilities won't know exactly what that question means. She stated that her organizations have been pushing for a much better question "Do you need an accommodation to participate in an election?" Ms. Goldkorn asked will the SOS be using a 14 font on the registration cards because it has to comply. Mr. Neubauer stated he believes the SOS will have it available upon request but the card shown will be the standard size.

VII. Discussion on New Voting Laws

Mr. Neubauer discussed new laws that made technical changes to processes for the Registrar of Voters. There are not that many new laws that impact voters or the voting community at large. AB-918 is the California Voting for All Act and it amends the facsimile ballot process for minority languages (3% languages) throughout California to provide greater access. Many of the changes to the law are items Riverside County has already been doing for years. The Registrar of Voters will be required to send the Secretary of State a list of all the bilingual poll workers who worked no later than 150 days after the election.

AB-918 requires more copies of the facsimile ballots be made available at the polling places than previously. The new law requires one to four facsimile ballots be available depending on various factors; the Registrar's Office currently provides eight facsimile ballots. The new law also changes some polling place language poster requirements. The Registrar's Office created an election poster display board that has all of the required posting notices on it. These boards were utilized at the November 2017 Election. The new law also requires facsimile ballots be available by mail upon request which is a new process for the Registrar's Office. Counties that go to the vote center model under SB-450 will need to track requests for facsimile ballots and automatically send them in their language in the future.

Mr. Reutter stated he has an issue with the amount of hours a poll worker has to work on Election Day. He asked if there is a way to split the hours. Mr. Neubauer stated that with a large election there are about 3,000 volunteers needed to work the polls. If the day was split in half that means the Registrar's Office would need to recruit 6,000 volunteers which is virtually impossible. There are exceptions where a day is split for student poll workers but logistically it makes the procedures harder when someone switches out in the middle of the day. Mr. Reutter stated that if Election Day was a holiday it might be easier to get volunteers.

Mr. Neubauer stated that the Registrar's Office will be working with the Language Accessibility Advisory Committee (LAAC) on the changes with AB-918. The LAAC kick-off meeting will be taking place on February 15th at 2:00 pm.

VIII. Discussion on VAAC's Participation with New/Updated Poll Worker Training Video on Accessibility

Mr. Neubauer shared that the Registrar's Office met with three members of the VAAC, Gabe Taylor, Mario Janesin and Diane Gamache, last week to discuss the training video. The consensus at the end of the meeting from our VAAC members was that the D.C. government video is suitable for the etiquette portion of our training. Immediately following that will be training on the most common accessibility tools that are sent to the polls such as the AVU and magnifying glass. Ms. Goldkorn asked if the D.C. video could be sent to the VAAC members. Mr. Neubauer stated that the video is available on YouTube and he can send the link. If anyone needs a video file, he would be happy to send that as well. Mr. Janesin stated the point of the video was for disability sensitivity and awareness training that can be used in the everyday world. He would also like to include the 10 Commandments of Communicating to People with Disabilities in the poll worker packets. Mr. Neubauer stated that the State provides a document called Disability Sensitivity at the Polls that covers the same items and it is already sent to the polls for the workers. The Registrar's Office will highlight it in the future training so poll workers are aware of the document.

IX. Questions/Comments

Mr. Reutter asked if the ROV has staff available to go speak to different communities about disabilities issues. Mr. Neubauer stated that the ROV is available to provide trainings on the AVUs and provide information about the VAAC. He stated that anyone interested in setting up a training can contact the Registrar's Office for more information.

Ms. Goldkorn stated that it is critical for the VAAC to be visible and engage with the community at different outreach events such as the Kids Expo in April and the Inland Empire Disabilities Collaborative Expo on March 24th. She asked if we can make plans for the VAAC and ROV staff to attend and be available to register people. Mr. Neubauer stated that he cannot make any promises on any specific events at this time. The Registrar's Office does review and research every request and tries to attend as many as possible. Ms. Goldkorn stated that the bill in congress H.R. 620 to eliminate the ADA is moving forward; she wanted everyone to be aware.

Mr. Janesin stated that the Inland Empire Disabilities Collaborative Expo will be taking place on March 24th at the Orange Show in San Bernardino. There were over 5,000 people with disabilities that attended the last event in 2016; the Riverside County Registrar of Voters did attend that event. Mr. Janesin has been reaching out to the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters to have their participation at the next expo and to encourage people to sign up for their VAAC and register to vote. He has found out that the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters does not do outreach events due to limited staff. Mr. Janesin would like to have San Bernardino County registration cards at the Riverside County table so people can register that live in San Bernardino County. Mr. Neubauer stated that any out of county registrations will be forwarded to the appropriate county so there is no need to have San Bernardino County registration cards.
